

CNC Machine:

With thanks to Jerry Leinsing, the first draft of a complete set of operating instructions is now complete. We are now ready to offer a "trial" class in CNC 101- Basic CNC Router Operation, during April. This class will consist of class work of three (3) class meetings (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) for two hours each and "homework" assignments which will require on the order of three (3) hours of independent study at home. Students will be required to have access to a computer running MS Windows with an Internet connection, as well as a proficiency in windows software, such as MS Work, e-Mail and preferable some form of a graphic program.

CNC Machining and Engraving – New course

Instructor Jerry Leinsing will be offering a class in how to safely and efficiently use our CNC Machine.

As this machine is very precise and repairs and replacement parts are expensive, there is a lot to learn to get the software, the student's desired design, the machine and the Woodworker all on the same path to success. (Pun intended!) Jerry has the knowledge and dedication to get all those components to work as one unit. If you do too, this might be for you.

This course is planned for 3 - 2 hour classes and the complex nature of the software, machine and Woodworker will require purchasing a detailed training manual and some homework, so this one is for serious learners. This course will include everything you need to cut and engrave your own designs after the class is over, but you'll be machining samples in this course to really learn how the process works.

If you're interested and not afraid of the deep dive necessary into the precision required by the software and intricacies of the machine or want to know more, see Jerry Leinsing.

A one-session demonstration type course will be offered later for those who are looking to find out what this machine is all about.

The Toy Department continues to build on our successful start to 2018.

We participated in one external community activity in February. Toys on the Square at Lake Sumter Landing on February 15th, where we collected \$70 regular donations and \$345 in toy sales for a total of \$415. My thanks to all the Toy Team members who donated their time and efforts to this activity.

Our Toy production activities continued at a brisk pace in February.

-We produced an additional 728 toys compared to 386 produced last February.

-This brings our 2018 production at the end of February to 1564, which means we are 778 toys ahead of last year's record pace.

-We have produced an additional 268 toy so far in March.

We made two shipments to Children's Home Society of Florida in February containing 351 toys with a donation value of \$4424. We are on target to meet our 2017-2018 fiscal year commitment to them.

We will be back at Spanish Springs town square on Wednesday March 14th from 5-8:30 to kick off our Spring TOYS on the SQUARE season.

We are offering a plain version exactly like the one we provide for indigent veterans for \$30 and a premium one designed by Voytek for \$50 (\$75 for a double-sized one). On the first day we took orders from 14 resident veterans pretty much evenly divided between the plain one and premium one.
